The NTCH working group committee invites you to submit abstracts for consideration for the conference programme. All abstracts will be reviewed by a panel of experts who will grade them for inclusion.

Abstracts should describe original research or project work. Accepted abstracts will be allocated for presentation in a workshop session, master class or poster. The submitting author/s will be notified of acceptance by **30th April 2008** with advice on allocated workshop sessions and instructions for presentation requirements by **30th May 2008**.

Abstracts should be submitted under one of the following themes:

Guidelines for abstract submission

- Abstracts must be submitted in English however the use of te reo Maori or reo from Pacific Islands communities is welcomed. Please provide subtext of translations where applicable.
- Abstracts must be a minimum of 250 words and no more than 300 words in length
- Abstracts must not contain symbols, tables, pictures or diagrams
- Abstracts must not contain symbols in the abstract title
- All abbreviations must be spelled out on first use
- Abstracts should be thoroughly checked for spelling and grammar
- Abstracts should contain the following subheadings: Background, Methods, Results and Conclusions
- References should NOT be included in the abstract
- You will be required to submit your abstract at the time of online registration and payment
- Abstracts may be submitted from **29th January 2008** until **31st March 2008** for consideration by the programme committee. Authors will be notified of acceptance by **30 April 2008**.

Conditions for abstract submission

- All abstract submitters will be notified by email of the acceptance of their abstract
- The committee decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into
- It is a condition of your abstract acceptance that you register for the conference
- All accepted abstracts will be available for download on the NTCC Hui website

By submitting an abstract the authors agree to the following:

- I have checked the accuracy of information and referencing in the submitted abstract
